We have been working hard planning for our week of birthday celebrations, and can now share with you some of the things which will be happenin during the week.

On Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> July, we have a very busy day – in the morning we have a visit from Hitchin Museum who will be setting up a Victorian Classroom for the children to experience and in the afternoon we have a visit from a magician who will be performing Victorian magic tricks for the children. On Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> July we are having a visit from a Magic Lantern performer, we are very excited to see this and learn more about it.
